- Creativity and Innovation



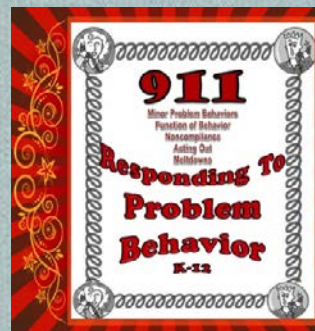
SEMINAR

Highlight the evidence-based practice of OTR, *the instructional questions, statements and/or gestures that maximize response from all students*. Learn and share observable ways to promote active engagement with students. Practice and demonstrate the four key components for optimal rates: teacher instructional talk, prompts, wait time and positive, specific feedback. Create a visual library of resources through vignettes for increasing individual and whole class participation during common core lessons.

Follow the mantra, "social skills should be taught to children using the same strategies that are used to teach academic skills." Delve deeper into the acquisition, maintenance and generalization of learning social skills using Depth of Knowledge levels. Learn how to seamlessly blend teaching social skills within cooperative learning lessons. Create vignettes of the top seven instructional strategies for teaching school-wide pro-social skills, using the classroom teaching matrix and routines necessary for common core instruction.

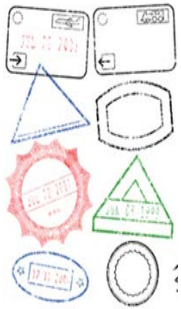

Practice implementation of prevention strategies based on function and demonstrate proactive strategies addressing executive function and social skill deficits.

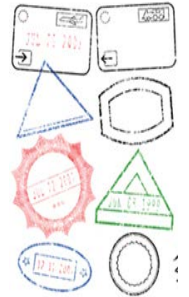
